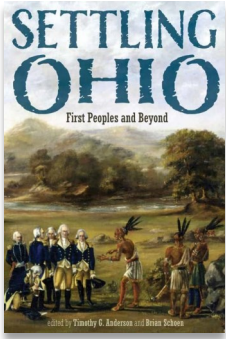


WINTER LECTURE SERIES

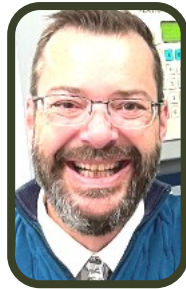

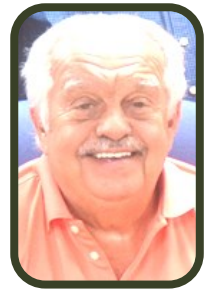
